What's New in NumisMaster

Things at NumisMaster are still going full steam ahead as we inch closer to the end of summer. I can't believe how fast 2025 has gone! The ever-changing prices of metals have kept us on our toes, with seemingly constant updates to our

melt values and bullion prices. This month, we focused on adding coins to countries that may not be high on collector's lists but are important, nonetheless. These countries include Grenada, Ivory Coast, and Moldova, to name a few. ♦

This Month's Frequently Asked Question:

We received a request from a member to explain how we select a KM number for a coin, especially those with a "1" or an "A" after the selected number. This was a great suggestion, and I agree with the member that some in our community may not be aware of the reason. I have selected Australia's 2025 "Year of the Snake" coins, minted by the Perth Mint, to give a better understanding.

The first coin was assigned as KM# 4814. As you can see, the second coin is the same, except for its color, so it gets assigned the .1 after the denomination.

In some cases, as with the Perth Mint's 2024 "Year

of the Dragon" \$1 coins, when multiple colors are released, each color has a different point number after (.1, .2, .3, etc).

If the coin features the same design but is made of a different metal, as seen with the platinum "Year of the Snake" coin, this causes it to have the "A" after the KM number. This rule only applies if the coin is an exact match in design and diameter.

United States Coronet Head Gold Half Eagles, Believe It Or Not

In a day when the price of gold has rocketed up to over \$3,000 per ounce, it may seem absolutely laughable to think of any gold coin as a bargain. Certainly, United States classic gold is the type of coin or coin series that should have gone right up through the roof along with the cost of gold on the commodity markets. All U.S. classic gold series have avid groups within the collecting community who keep very good track of all the dates and mint marks within a series. Despite this attention, it appears that there are a few dates among the Coronet Head \$5 half eagles that still might qualify as bargains of some sort – believe it or not.

The tail end of the series

The Coronet Head \$5 half eagles have a long history, one that we might consider turbulent. From their first unveiling in 1839 all the way up to the changeover to the Indian Head series in 1908, there are some extremely high mintages, and some that are downright rare. One might think that from 1900 until the end of the series, the mintages were all relatively large, since with the passage of time, more gold had been turned up. Certainly, a mintage of at least one million ought to have become common – that idea of what constitutes common being one of the two things we always look at when hunting for bargains. The other is price, which we will get to in a moment.

With that warm-up, it's probably no surprise to find that from 1900 to 1908, there are indeed some multi-million mintages of Coronet half eagles, and there are some very scarce ones. The 1901-S is king of the hill, as it were, with 3,648,000 coined. The low guy on the totem pole is the 1904-S, with only 97,000 to its official tally. That's a big spread, and it is quite logical to expect the same when it comes to the cost for any of these gold pieces.

Some kind of price point

In all our bargain hunts, we start out by looking for a price point, and there is no reason to deviate from the plan now. But we have often tried to stay at about

\$100 per coin, which just won't do the trick for the \$5 half eagles. Each of these has 0.24187 ounces of gold, from which we can calculate a base price. The price of gold does fluctuate daily, but as this is being written, the precious metal is selling for \$3,353 per ounce. If we do the math, for 0.24187 ounces, we will have to pay a rock-bottom minimum of \$811. Anyone selling for less than that has not been doing their homework.

Armed with the idea that we have to spend a bit more than \$811 per Coronet half eagle, the next step is to check out prices for one of them from a grade like very fine, VF-20, up to something like a lower uncirculated grade, such as MS-60. For quite some time, the prices as the grades move up from VF-20, to EF-40, to AU-55, and to MS-60, are pretty linear, with each costing a bit more as the grade climbs. Trying to land any of these gold pieces in much higher grades, such as MS-65, always means paying a lot more. That's because there almost always seems to be a jumping off point in the middle of the mint state grades, a spot where the price really rockets up.

Again, with our base price in mind, it is noteworthy that a 1901-S and its runner-up in this short run of dates, a 1903-S, both cost the same, about \$875 in MS-60. As we said, they have to be

somewhat above the price of the precious metal alone. But what about the less common members of "the family?"

Rarities within the group

We mentioned that the 1904-S is the least common of this group of half eagles. Yet while we expect it to cost more, it's something of a surprise to find that roughly \$1,500 will be enough for the purchase. For a coin that is more than 35 times less common than the 1901-S, the price is only about double? This is amazing.

For any of us asking why, the short answer is probably an obvious one: not many people collect a series like the Coronet Head \$5 half eagles by date and mint mark. It's probably much more common for folks to snag just one for a type set. So a scarce date like this doesn't automatically see its reflection in its cost.

With that being said, no matter how attractive the 1904-S price is (or isn't!), the logical next step is to look at all the dates and mint marks in this short set and see how low we can go without adding any cost to our purchase. When we land on the 1906-D, for example, with a total mintage of only 320K, we have found the proverbial pay dirt. Even though this particular half eagle qualifies as pretty scarce, the price lists in Numismatic News, as well as several other references, simply list it as having the same price as its common cousins, in every grade from VF-20 up to MS-60.

Can we go further?

We'll leave the next step to each of us among the collecting aficionados. It's worth looking at each of the official Mint tallies for a particular Coronet half eagle to see if we can find other examples with relatively low totals that still have relatively low prices. No, we will never, ever, ever find any of these gold beauties with prices of something like \$100. It's just not going to happen. But looking at some of the scarcer dates and mint marks in this series, we may very well be pleasantly surprised at several spots. It does appear that there are still some bargains in United States gold. ♦



Recovering Treasures from Under the Sea

Shipwreck coins are more than just numismatic treasures, they are time capsules from America's maritime past. Recovered from vessels lost at sea, these coins often reveal as much about global trade, exploration, and historical economies as they do about the minting techniques of their time.

Among the most famous U.S.-related shipwrecks is the S.S. Central America, known as the "Ship of Gold." In August 1857, several hundred passengers and over \$1.6 million in freshly minted gold were boarded onto the S.S. Sonora. Eventually, both passengers and cargo were transferred to the S.S. Central America, a side-wheel steamer that sailed from Panama up the East Coast of the United States. By noon on Sept. 11, the ship had been caught in a hurricane and was taking on water. The captain, Captain William Herndon, gave orders in an attempt to save the women and children on the lifeboats. That evening, the ship was lost at sea, taking many with it as well as the cargo. The ship sank about 160 miles offshore of Charleston, S.C.

The ship's loss contributed to the Panic of 1857, and its recovery over a century later in the 1980s yielded a remarkable cache of \$20 Liberty Head gold double eagles, many of which were preserved in astonishing condition thanks to their sealed environment in the deep.

Other notable wrecks include the S.S. Republic, lost in 1865 with thousands of coins and other supplies headed to New Orleans to aid in the post-Civil War rebuilding efforts. The S.S. Brother Jonathan, which also carried a trove of California Gold Rush-era coins, is another well-known ship carrying gold coins that was lost to the depths.

These coins, which were lost for centuries, often show evidence of their underwater journey, such as toning, corrosion, or encrustation, which some consider to enhance their historical and collectible value.

Grading services such as PCGS and NGC have certified many of these recovered coins, often designating them with the name of the shipwreck on their label. U.S. shipwreck coins merge numismatics with adventure, archaeology, and American history, making them a fascinating subfield within the hobby. ♦

Coins That Gave Life to the Hobby

Q. David Bowers, the author of a library's worth of enjoyable hobby books, articles, and columns, had his first *Coins* magazine article appear in the April 1966 issue.

Under the headline, "The Coins and Tokens that Gave Life to a Great Hobby" (with the subtitle, "Since the earliest days of coin collecting, Americans and Britons have shared a common esteem for the Condors and colonials"), Bowers wrote:

"In the United States, coin collecting has been a popular hobby only since about 1860. In fact, it has been only since the beginning of the 20th century that numismatics has encompassed more than just a few hundred enthusiasts in America.

"In contrast, coin collecting has been a popular pursuit in England since the 18th century. Virtually every museum in England has a numismatic display, often with many outstanding rare specimens, and English books on coins have been published for hundreds of years.

"The popularization of coin collecting in England on a widespread scale began in the 1787-1796 period. In these years, the country suffered from severe monetary problems. Coins could not be kept in circulation; they were melted down as soon as they were issued. Only a small fraction of the few coins in circulation were genuine; the rest were counterfeits. As a result, the latter portion of the 18th century saw very few official coin issues. There were spans of many years during which no official copper or silver coins were struck.

"To fill the need for small change in commerce, thousands of unofficial small tokens appeared. These were popularly known as Conder tokens (after James Conder, whose *An Arrangement of Provincial Coins, Tokens and Medalets*' was the standard work on the subject. *Ed*). It was a popular pursuit of the gentlemen of the day to collect these tokens by variety. Magazines devoted space to the fad, and *The Virtuoso's Companion*, an illustrated guidebook, had wide circulation.

"It is not known how many Englishmen participated in token collecting, but the number was probably on the order of several thousand, if not more. When the fad subsided, many people left the field of coin collecting, just as many people leave the United States at the end of each recurring boom. However, many collectors stayed on and developed their interest.

"In 1793, the United States mint issued its first coins for circulation, the half-cents and cents struck at Philadelphia. In the following year, silver coins were issued for the first time. The 1794 denomination consisted of the half-dime, half-dollar, and silver dollar. Two years later, the dime and quarter denominations appeared. The United States com-

manded great interest in the hearts of English collectors. Many numismatists included American coins as part of their British Empire collections.

“During the 1790s, many fine American coins were acquired by English numismatists. During the same time in America, there was little interest in coins. Not even the United States Mint bothered to save specimens of its own coinage. There was no national museum or other institution interested in numismatics. The number of collectors was virtually nil. Even as late as 1840, it was estimated that there were fewer than two dozen coin collectors in all of the United States.

“The early American coins known as colonials are intertwined closely with British coinage. In fact, more than just a few of them originated there. Others, such as the coinage of Massachusetts, did not originate in England but were subject to strong British influence; the standardization of the data in 1652 on the Massachusetts coins resulted from fear of the British authorities.

“Among the many coins struck in the British Isles which are now collected as colonials by American numismatists are the St Patrick or Mark Newby halfpennies and farthings, the Rosa Americana coins, the Hibernia or Woods pieces, several colonial pattern issues, and a large number of tokens.

“Token issues such as the Talbot, Allum & Lee cents, the Franklin Press tokens, the Kentucky tokens, the Myddleton tokens, and many of the Washington pieces are not of American origin at all but were part of the thousands of Conder tokens circulated in Britain during the late 1780s and early 1790s. The appeal to the numismatist’s interest in die varieties is attested by the multitude of edge letterings and mulings occurring in these

pieces. There is no logic, for instance, in the combination of a Talbot, Allum & Lee token and a reverse depicting a British cavalry troop or a church in York! Such mulings were created solely for sale to collectors.

“Today, the coins of British origin are so intermingled with those of U.S. origin that it is sometimes difficult to sort them out. The origin of still other pieces is undetermined.

“For instance, the guidebook says, ‘The elephant pieces were probably struck in England.’ The exact time and place of mintage have been lost to history. The guidebook’s assumption seems to be a safe one. Elephant tokens are found with fair frequency in England, and most older collections have a representative specimen. In addition, a number of specimen strikings are known to have originated in England, including strikings over British coinage. In fact, the true situation might be that these coins circulated exclusively in England and did not circulate in America at all!

“One London dealer asked us why American collectors were interested in voce populi coins. These pieces were struck in Ireland and were circulated in the British Isles. There is no evidence, to our knowledge, that the pieces were either designed or intended for the American colonies or were actively circulated there. We could only suggest that the voce populi pieces are collected by tradition, by virtue of the fact that Americans have been collecting them for many years. Perhaps they were listed in some early compendium of colonial coins by error. One mistake could have led to another, with the result that they are now firmly entrenched in the American colonial coinage.

“I am happy that American collectors buy our voce populi pieces,” the British dealer said. “Irish coins were very low sellers, and without the American market our voce populi pieces would be unsalable.”

“During the early 20th century, England was considered a gold mine for American collectors and dealers. Many of the finest pieces now in American cabinets were obtained then. In the case of certain American colonial pieces mentioned earlier, these were originally struck in England. In the case of early American mint issues, such as the copper and silver coins of the 1790s and early 1800s, these were collected by English numismatists many years ago when there was no comparable numismatic interest in the United States.

“Can United States coins be bought readily in England today? There is no definite answer to this. Perhaps the best answer would be that American coins can be bought, although not readily and certainly not inexpensively.

“In the early 1900s, in fact as late as the 1940s, British dealers had an attractive selection of American and American-related coins for sale. Anyone writing to virtually any leading British dealer could receive a price quotation on uncirculated Hibernia pieces, uncirculated and proof Talbot, Allum & Lee pieces, and so on. Usually, the same dealers also had a number of choice United States mint issues on hand. Fine specimens of 1793 cents, 1793 half cents, 1796 quarters, and other rare issues appeared with frequency in British dealer cabinets; the dealers actively sought American business in this respect.

“In recent years, two things have happened to change the situation. First, England (and all of Europe) has been inundated by waves of American tourists. Many are coin collectors and will buy anything and everything offered for sale. Often, they do not bother to check the price but just assume that it is cheaper than they would have to pay in the United States. The second factor is the education of the British dealers. Every British dealer, from the smallest part-time vest-pocket operator to the old-time established dealer of London, is cognizant of the latest American coin values and of the tremendous interest on the part of Americans in their own coins. Every one of them has a copy of the latest *Guide Book of U.S. Coins* on hand, and, more often than not, subscribes to and reads the American numismatic periodicals.

“The experience of a fellow dealer who found an uncirculated Lafayette dollar in a junk box marked ‘miscellaneous foreign coins’ in England during World War II is not likely to be repeated today!


“To be sure, there are still American coins to be found in England. A visit to any of the London dealers will, more often than not, result in the sight of a selection of American colonial tokens, Indian cents, and so on. However, it has been our experience that the grades are not exceptional, and the prices are certainly not on wholesale levels. More often than not, the prices asked will be equal to full American retail or even higher.”



Speaking of Conders, the March 1966 issue of *Coins* magazine focused on one carrying an image of the Bard of Avon, William Shakespeare. In “Poet on a Halfpenny,” a non-bylined piece, *Coins* wrote:

“Bell, in his useful work on Conder tokens, *Commercial Coins 1787-1804*, suggests that the Shakespeare token with which we are presently concerned was issued by Joseph Farror, a tea dealer, fire insurance agent, auctioneer, grocer, and aspirant poet of Birmingham in county Warwickshire, England.

“Mr. Farror is of interest here because through his Shakespeare token, he has handed down to us one of the few definitive pieces in the Shakespearean mosaic. One can point to this piece and say, ‘Here is an interesting token featuring a bust of William Shakespeare, who was of enough renown in Warwickshire to [be] granted this slight numismatic recognition.’

“Little else concerning Shakespeare will be granted without argument, for little is known and much of it is contested. A shadow passed, leaving a giant’s footprints ... a strange shadow, one that formed the grandest phrases in the English language

yet saw not their grandeur. Shakespeare left no written reference to his dramas and poetry, but 'if poetry bespeaks the inner man,' he thought his time could have been better applied to other endeavors. In one of his sonnets, which are considered autobiographical, he laments:

"When to the sessions of sweet silent thought

"I summon up remembrance of things past,

"I sigh the lack of many things I sought,


"And with old woes new wail my dear time's waste.

"This Warwickshire Shakespeare halfpenny is unusual not only in that it honors the peer of English drama, but also in that it is accepted as a genuine trade token although lacking the basic requirement for inclusion in this category: name and address of issuer. In fairness to those who assumed the chore of making this decision, they could hardly have chosen otherwise. The token is one of fine workmanship and superior weight, and its 31mm size generously exceeds that of most other tokens of the era, which usually fall in the 27-29mm range. Its size and weight exceed that of the 1770-75 George III halfpennies current at the time.

"This all-around excellence is working to the detriment of collectors today, for although 10 tons of this token were struck, it is becoming scarce. Due to their good weight, many went into the melting pot. Others found their way into the souvenir trove of non-collectors who were attracted simply by the bust of Shakespeare, much as scientists will carry the Isaac Newton token for a pocket piece, churchmen the ones featuring St. Paul's cathedral, or the male animal in general, a sharply struck Lady Godiva.

"Dalton & Hammer list four varieties of this token, all dated 1791, with plain edge, and closely resembling the one pictured here. The variations are a matter of fullness of the reverse cornucopiae, the use of a pellet instead of a trefoil stop following the obverse legend, and nearness of the pellet to the obverse legend. Dalton & Hammer also list a Shakespeare token (probably a counterfeit mule) dated 1792 and with the reverse depicting Vulcan seated at work.

"The bust of Shakespeare can also be found on the obverse of a London & Middlesex halfpenny, with the identical 'Commerce' reverse found on the Warwickshire halfpenny. These two Shakespeare tokens (both designed by Mainwaring and minted by Lutwyche) are similar even to the use of a trefoil stop following legends. Naturally, the obverse legends differ, being Warwickshire and London & Middlesex respectively. The London & Middlesex halfpenny exists in five varieties of edge: three types of milling, one plain edge, and one inscribed (Reynold's) edge. All are dated 1792. None is considered scarce." ♦

Ships on Coins

Have you ever looked out and admired beautiful boats moored at a marina, dock, or yacht club? Perhaps you have seen those marvelous cruise ships, or have been fortunate enough to be on a cruise yourself, and been awestruck by the enormous size of such a gigantic vessel? Maybe you have been part of or observed the mesmerizing parade of ships that are part of Fleet Week in New York on Memorial Day Weekend? You may have sailed the high seas on a stunning sailboat or watched one from the shore. I am pretty confident you have at least seen these amazing modes of transportation in movies or on television. I mean, who hasn't seen *Titanic*? Many people find seafaring a beautiful and inspirational way to travel.

In numismatics, there is a historical significance to maritime-themed coins and medals. Each piece tells a unique story of ambition, exploration, and discovery, often displaying sophisticated and interesting details. Some of these pieces are created to commemorate historical ships like Christopher Columbus' ship, the *Nina*, or to pay tribute to a ship's grandeur and untimely demise, as is the case with the *Titanic*. Many United States coins feature significant and historic ships. Canada, too, has released many phenomenal creations, including gold coins that picture different types of tall ships and other seafaring vessels. In addition to numerous ancient civilizations, many modern

countries mint magnificent coins showing all sorts of maritime vessels. There are hundreds, or perhaps thousands, of coins from all corners of the globe that depict ships or boats. Here, we are going to take a look at just a handful of these precious and amazing little discs. I am going to highlight, describe, and critique some pieces that stand out, from my personal perspective, for their significance, importance, and beauty. Given that most ship coins are attractive, these in particular have their own style and unique artistic, if not numismatic, value. Let's journey across the world's oceans, just like mariners of yore, and discover the treasure that lies in ship coins.

United States Classic Commemorative Half Dollars

The United States presented an extraordinary series of Commemorative Half Dollars. The market being oversaturated with coins commemorating just about anything, there is no shortage of beautifully designed half dollar ship coins. Here are some noteworthy examples.

As we sail along the current of the most memorable ship coins, we discover the United States' very own first commemorative half dollar. The World Columbian

Exposition Half Dollar was minted for just two years between 1892 and 1893 and featured Columbus's flagship, the *Santa Maria*, atop two globes representing the Old World and the New World. This coin was sold at the Chicago World's Fair to celebrate the 400th anniversary of Christopher Columbus's arrival in the New World. Pictured on the reverse of the coin is a nicely detailed image of both the globes and the ship. It is a great example of one of the first coins from the United States to represent a sailing ship.

To immortalize the landing of the Pilgrims at Plymouth, Mass., the United States produced the Pilgrim Tercentenary Half Dollar that was minted in 1920 and 1921. The reverse of the coin illustrates the *Mayflower*, the ship that brought the pilgrims to America. It is an interesting

rendering of one of the most historic ships as it moves through rough seas at full sail.

In 1924, the U.S. produced another half dollar featuring a sailing vessel on its reverse. This is the Huguenot-Walloon Tercentenary Half Dollar. The ship that is displayed is the *Nieuw Nederland*. A good side view captures the essence of ships of the day. Nicely designed with desirable details, this coin has great eye appeal and would be a perfect addition to any ship-type coin collection.

Going with the current, our excursion to observe beautiful ship coins leads us to another commemorative coin that was issued in 1935 - the Hudson Sesquicentennial Half Dollar. This is the first of our half dollars to embrace a craft on the obverse of the coin instead of the reverse. The ship, *Half Moon*, was captained by Henry Hudson and is shown running at full sail. Its rendering is done with wonderful precision and elaboration. When looking at this coin in person, it pops! I believe it's a distinctive coin to add as part of one's personal booty.

As a native Long Islander, I have to add one of my favorite ship coins to our itinerary, the Long Island Tercentenary Half Dollar. It was minted as a commemorative coin in 1936. The ship is engraved on the reverse and shows a Dutch vessel with full-blown sails. It is portrayed simply, but artistically. This coin's composition is delightful to look at. I like it because its uncomplicated design is different from most ship coins. Much praise should be given to the designer, Howard K. Weinman, for his marvelous creation.

The Delaware Tercentenary Half Dollar of 1936 features the ship *Kalmar Nyckel* on its reverse. The 300th anniversary of the landing of the Swedes in Delaware was the occasion for the issue of this souvenir half dollar. Skillfully done, the presentation of the ship looks majestic and was well received. As you can see, I believe most ship coins are beautiful, and this is no exception.

The next stop on our ship coin tour is a bit unusual compared to the other half dollar commemoratives I have mentioned so far. The Norfolk, Va., Bicentennial Half Dollar was minted in 1936. The obverse shows the seal of the city of Norfolk with a three-masted ship at its center. All the mottos and legends encir-

cling the tiny sailing ship make the design too crowded for me. I do like the details on the small vessel, but to my eyes, there is too much going on. I still like this coin just because it has a ship on it.

Modern United States Commemorative Coins

That ends the Classic Commemorative Half Dollar leg of our cruise. Now we can extend our voyage and take in the modern-day commemoratives. The first modern commemorative silver dollar in which a ship appears is the Christopher Columbus Quincentenary Silver Dollar. It was also minted in 1992, like its half dollar little sister. Although this rather bizarre and strange coin only includes half of a ship, or more accurately, the halves of two different ships, I am including it

on our journey... because a ship is a ship, right? Well, the composition of this coin is weird. It shows half of a 1492 sailing vessel, joined with half of a 1992 space shuttle, and was minted to celebrate 500 years of exploration.

The Christopher Columbus Quincentenary Half Dollar was minted in 1992, memorializing the 500th anniversary of Columbus' first trip to the New World. It exhibits his three ships on the reverse: the *Nina*, the *Pinta*, and the *Santa Maria*. The inscription UNITED STATES OF AMERICA encircles the ships. The vessels are pictured in close proximity to each other, have good detail, and the coin has a nice design overall. When compared to its predecessor, the Columbus ships of 1892, I feel the newer version is somewhat inferior.

The Jamestown 400th Anniversary Silver Dollar, minted in 2007, has three sailing ships on its reverse. It is reminiscent of the elements already seen on the 2000 state quarter, but they are arranged differently. The ship's details are not as artistically complex as those found on other ship coins, but it's fair enough to say that the overall concept is decent. Still a good coin to add to a ship coin collection.

United States Quarters and a Nickel

The Virginia state quarter issued in 2000 celebrates the 400th anniversary of the settlement of Jamestown. The reverse of this quarter dollar presents three ships:

the Susan Constant, Godspeed, and Discovery, all of which were part of the expedition that led to the first permanent settlement in North America and were eventually named Jamestown. The ships are designed simplistically and do not exhibit much detail. But this coin was part of the state quarter program, and those coins did not exhibit many good qualities. On the bright side, at least it gave us another ship-designed coin. If you would like to add one to your collection, you can often find this coin in pocket change.

The Maine State Quarter of 2003 was minted as business strikes as well as proof coins. This coin is a wee bit different in that the ship is quite diminutive in size compared to other coins featuring sailing vessels. The reverse of this quarter dollar shows Pemaquid Point Lighthouse atop a granite coast and a tiny schooner at sea. Although the lighthouse is the focal point for this coin, it still has a ship placed on it, so it counts!

The design on Rhode Island's contribution to the State Quarter program is fitting for the Ocean State. It shows a vintage sailboat in front of the Pell Bridge in Narragansett Bay. Not quite a "ship", it's still a nicely engraved boat, and it's enjoyable to view.

Somehow, I almost overlooked our very own 2004 Jefferson Nickel. It must have been the heavy fog that obstructed my binoculars. The reverse of these five-cent pieces shows Lewis and Clark's keelboat used during their westward exploration. This boat bears no specific name and was referred to as "the boat" or "the barge". It was a custom-built 55-foot vessel. The coin is a nice little, affordable gem to add to a ship coin collection.

United States Medal

In 1960, the United States commissioned a wonderful medal to be minted. The Medallion Art Company, in business from 1903 to 1972, was hired to produce the medal. It commemorates the world's largest ship, the Enterprise, which was the first nuclear-powered aircraft carrier. It is composed of silver, and it's a fantastic tribute to an amazing American vessel. Pictured on the obverse is the U.S.S. Enterprise at sea, with beautiful clouds above it. Although shown at a distance (because the ship is so big), you get the impression that this was one mighty ship.

I like the way this medal was crafted; it has a sort of old-world look.

From Canada

In 2024, Canada continued its Tall Ships pure gold coin series with a rendering of a Topsail Schooner on its reverse. Designed by Canadian artist Bonnie Ross, this coin features a view of a two-masted topsail schooner heeled over with all sails set to catch the wind. This coin exhibits exquisite beauty and remarkable detail. Every part of this design, from the ship to the sky and water, shows irresistible elements and has wonderful eye appeal.

Canada has a beautifully designed \$200 half-ounce fine gold coin that was minted in 2023, which is also a part of its Tall Ships collection. On its reverse is an early morning view of a full-rigged ship sailing in calm waters with all sails set. The full complement of its great sails, which are beautifully depicted, inspires dignified magnificence on a gorgeous coin. This coin is a must-see; it's done to perfection.

The Canadian dime, or 10-cent piece, is perhaps the most recognizable ship coin in Canada and is possibly the most regularly used circulating ship coin in the world. It was introduced in 1937 and featured a boat, specifically a Bluenose Schooner. It continued with the same design until 2021, when the Royal Canadian Mint issued a newly designed piece. A simple, clean design keeps this small coin interesting.

Propelling us along at about 70 knots, we see that Canadian coinage minted by The Royal Canadian Mint has been a world leader in producing high-quality, beautiful, innovative, and award-winning coins since 1908. As part of their Tall Ships Series, they minted a very special \$15 1-ounce silver proof coin that featured a Three-Masted Schooner in 2025. The reverse was enhanced with selective color, using a special minting process. It shows a starboard quarter view of a schooner under full sail. A masterful and colorful design makes this special coin come alive!

World Coinage

The United Kingdom 1/2 penny ship coin was issued from 1937 to 1970. It was made of bronze, and the reverse shows a three-masted sailing ship, Sir Francis Drake's Golden Hind, in a skillfully done engraving for an older coin. I love the look of this piece, especially

when you see one toned in a chocolate brown. I believe it enhances the overall beauty and "old world look" of this piece.

Our navigation charts lead us to Germany next. In 1932, the mint produced a Donation Medal forged in gold to commemorate 69 lives that were lost at sea on the training ship Niobe. The obverse of this exquisitely detailed coin depicts Niobe in rough waters surrounded by legends scripted in Latin. A must-see for any coin collector or ship enthusiast, it is splendidly illustrated.

Next, I spy a very unique coin issued by the Republic of Belarus, a landlocked country in Eastern Europe. They rendered a wonderfully crafted silver coin with not one, but two different images of the same ship on the reverse! Pictured on the left is the image of one of the biggest and fastest sailing vessels in the world, the Sedov. Then, to the right is a diminished profile view of the same craft. A great idea and brilliant execution of a classic sailing ship by its designers, Dobrochna Surajewska and Svetlana Nekrasova.

The Bahamas are no exception when considering magnificent and artful coins. In 1993, they created a wonderful piece, a five-dollar commemorative, issued to celebrate this country's pirate history. It is composed of .925 silver; a great sailing ship adorns the reverse with a blue marlin on the left and a flamingo on the right. I appreciate the smooth sailing and the overall simple design of the very pretty proof coin.

Back in 1858, Newfoundland, one of the Canadian provinces, issued a Merchant Token that was considered Emergency

Coinage. Emergency coinage, which is also called Notgeld, is issued in times of economic or political crisis when the central bank's supply of money is inadequate. This 1/2 Penny was composed of copper and is fairly unique. It has a sailing ship facing to its right on the obverse, instead of on its reverse. I find this very interesting. In this case, the reverse has just the large date 1858.

There is a very unusually shaped coin with a beautiful rendition of a ship on its reverse. It hails from Agalega, a nation that consists of two small islands in the western part of the Indian Ocean. It is a 500 Rupee coin dated 2023, it is struck on silver-plated brass and has a mintage of just 150 pieces. The pristine rendering of the ship on this unique piece created a wave of excitement for me. This great-looking coin, pictured the HMS *Clorinde*, is facing right and sailing on the high seas. Adding to its distinctiveness is its square shape and inwardly rounded corners! This is a must-see for ship coin lovers.

Cruising around the world to China, we find this republic also has ships on a number of its coins. A standard circulated coin, the 1 Yuan, was issued from 1933 to 1949 and was mostly silver in composition. The ship shown on this coin is a junk and is known as a "Junk Dollar". It is quite a bit different from what we have observed so far. The two-masted vessel sails to the right with one Chinese ideogram on either side. An interesting note about this coin is that in 1949, three United States Mints re-struck many of these coins with minor variations.

From 1932-1951, Portugal had a nice little circulating silver coin dated that presented a Caravelle sailing boat, a ship of the 15th century, on the obverse. The lettering surrounding the boat reads: **REPUBLICA PORTUGUESA**. The boat is sailing left and is a good rendition of that type of vessel. This is a well-balanced example of a quality coin for circulation.

Italy also had a number of fantastically designed coins depicting ships. One that stands out shows the three ships of Christopher Columbus on its obverse facing right at full sail. The 500 Lire silver coin is smartly laid out and was issued from 1958 to 2001.

Australia has produced great coin designs for many years. Of particular note is

their commemorative issue for the 200th anniversary of the First Fleet. It was composed of 11 boats that marked the beginning of European colonization of the mainland. The designers managed to introduce yet another fantastic design on the reverse of this coin, displaying three of the ships in the background and a rowboat with nine men in the foreground. This 10-dollar silver, non-circulating beauty looks almost three-dimensional as you glance at its surface.

RMS Titanic

The Titanic, likely one of the most iconic ships of all time, surely will never be forgotten for its untimely demise, and its story is kept alive on some beautiful coins. The faithful British ocean liner sank on April 15th, 1912, as a result of hitting an iceberg on her maiden voyage from Southampton, England, to New York City in the United States. It was one of the deadliest peacetime disasters of a single ship. The doomed ship and its sad story inspired a lasting legacy in popular culture and have been immortalized many times and by many countries worldwide with interesting and memorable coinage. Here are just a few that I have found most interesting.

The Republic of Liberia issued a non-circulating commemorative five-dollar copper-nickel coin in 1998. On the reverse, it features a small portrait of its captain, Edward John Smith, above the Titanic that is listing backwards as it started to sink, and has a lifeboat in the foreground loaded with ill-fated passengers. The design of the coin is well executed, is simple, but has good details.

The ship that was deemed "unsinkable" is also presented on a coin produced by the Cook Islands in 2022. This 50-gram Titanic coin has a 1-dollar face value and is composed of pure copper and is a non-circulating coin. A delightful and unusual piece with the obverse bearing the Effigy of Queen Elizabeth II above a world map and a schematic of the Titanic below. The reverse has a bold design, with a strong rendering of the ship as it strikes the iceberg. The lettering **TITANIC** appears below. This coin is very powerful in design and very artistically pleasing.

Moving into uncharted waters, this next piece is a magnificent tribute to the RMS Titanic because it has some of the most unique design elements and uses of new materials. The Solomon Islands \$25 is a one-ounce gold piece with Mother of Pearl inlay in its center and is a feast for your eyes! This very limited edition piece has a mintage of only 110 pieces worldwide and was minted in Brunswick, Germany, by the MDM mint. The stunning Mother of Pearl view of the ship in the center captures the essence of the fantasticalness of the legendary vessel, and this coin just glimmers. If you are a coin collector, numismatist, history buff, or just enjoy owning different and special items, this would be a coin for you! It's a must-see if you haven't yet.

I would get a sinking feeling if I did not mention a small but important coin also minted by the Cook Islands in 1922. It is gold and just 11 mm in diameter; it commemorates one of the most tragic maritime disasters in history. The coin shows the Titanic at the moment it hits the iceberg that sealed its fate in history. I wanted to include this piece in this article because of its historic significance. It is well done, especially considering it was engraved on such a small surface.

H.M.S. Bounty

Another noteworthy ship in history, depicted many times in books, movies,

and television, is the famous HMS Bounty and its storied history. This British naval vessel is known for the 1789 mutiny led by Fletcher Christian against Captain William Bligh. The Cook Islands once again managed to commemorate history with a numismatic masterpiece. It is a 1-ounce pure silver coin with the inscriptions "ONE DOLLAR" and "HMS BOUNTY" and the date 2022. An interesting fact about this coin is that no one is absolutely sure who actually minted it for the Cook Islands, but it was very likely produced by a reputable mint if its stunning details and design are any indication. I would never throw this coin overboard!

The Royal Australian Mint also produced another version of "The Bounty" with a timeless rendition in a silver commemorative coin minted in 2019. Depicted on the reverse is a scene in which Captain Bligh and his crew were set adrift from their ship, with the Bounty directly behind them. MUTINY ON THE BOUNTY, 1789, and FIVE DOLLARS surround this timeless image. A very intricate and detailed version of both the ship and boat, with the sailors, captures the emotions of the crew that were part of this controversial mutiny.

The HMS Bounty was also immortalized on a gleaming gold coin issued by the Isle of Man in 1982. This One Crown gold piece was artistically done with its reverse showing the famed ship and a portrait of Fletcher Christian in an oval above and to the right of the ship. Masterfully done, this is a stunning piece, and another great coin that should be considered a beautiful ship coin.

Ancient Coins

Modern-day coins aren't the only ones that have ships placed on their surface. Even ancient coins portray a variety of seafaring vessels. Ships were even a big part of history thousands of years ago. One of the more interesting coins depicting ships of the ancient world was the legionary Mark Antony Silver Denarius. It was issued in 32-31 B.C. during the lead-up to the Battle of Actium. Antony's ships teamed with Cleopatra's forces and unsuccessfully came head to head with the forces of Octavian (Augustus), ending the Roman civil war. Although crudely made, the minting process was much more primitive than it is today.

This most recognizable and collectible ancient coin is a wonderful piece to add to a ship coin collection.

Demetrius I of Macedon ruled between 301 and 283 B.C.E. and issued very handsome silver Tetradrachms to celebrate his naval victories. On the reverse of this piece is pictured Poseidon, who is about to hurl his trident. These ancient coins were crudely formed back in the early days of coin production. Still, it's a wonderful piece that displays our theme in a time when the minting process was in its infancy. What fun it would be to hold in your hand a bit of history that is over 2,300 years old.

Surely the most famous ship of all time is Noah's Ark. It is perhaps the oddest representation of an ancient ship coin. In the town of Apameia in Phrygia, Greek-speaking Jews became magistrates in the city government and commissioned this coin. A mountain near the town was considered the resting place of the ark, so it was only logical to commemorate this biblical story on local coinage. Although described in Genesis 6:15 as 300 cubits long, 50 cubits wide, and 30 cubits deep, the ark is depicted as small and basket-like. It includes two individuals, reportedly Noah and his wife. Amusingly, the "boat" seems barely big enough to hold the patriarch and his family, let alone all those animals! I guess the creator of the coin took a lot of artistic liberties. Who would have thought Noah's Ark would be rendered on a coin?

Submarine Coin

Should I take the chance and submerge into reviewing yet another type of ship to be pictured on a coin? A little different than all of the previous ones mentioned, I think I will plunge ahead and include the submarine! Rather than staying afloat and riding the waves of the sea, a submarine can dive to the deepest depths of the ocean. In 2015, Canada got their hair wet and produced a 1 oz fine silver coin to honor one of its first submarines of the First World War. The CC Class submarine is prominently featured in the center of the image on the reverse of this coin. Its hull is pointed forward towards you as though it is emerging from the center of the coin. A "water line" divides the ship so that your point of view is partially above water and partially below

the water. A sailor can be seen surveying the horizon above the water. As an artist, I find this extraordinary piece to be a visually stunning design. It seems to be suspended between two worlds.

A Different Kind of Ship

I will conclude with what is possibly the most unusual ship in this article. It is a ship that does not travel on or even below the water, but rather, the final frontier - space. It is none other than the fictional Starship Enterprise, commanded by James T. Kirk. Although a fictional ship and captain, The Perth Mint of Australia created a commemorative coin in 2015 to celebrate Star Trek: the Original Series, a television show that debuted in 1966 and ran for three years, with a beautiful colorized coin. This one-ounce silver proof coin is done extremely well, showing the ship in silver with the background of space in color. The inscription on this creative coin says, STAR TREK: THE ORIGINAL SERIES, and USS ENTERPRISE NCC-1701, its trademark number. For all ship enthusiasts and Star Trek fans, this would be a fun coin to own.

As the sun sets over the horizon...

...we are reminded that mankind has produced these small pieces of art throughout recorded history and in all corners of the globe. Hopefully, this article acquainted you with a variety of ship coins, although I have only touched upon a small fraction of them. Our ferocious and ongoing fascination with these vessels is evidenced by the sheer number of ship coins out there. Like the depths of the seas or the vastness of space, there are an enormous number of nautical coins yet to be discovered. I could write many articles and fill volumes of books with more exciting and creative coins featuring ships that I know you would find interesting. I find the subject irresistible. There's no end in sight for discovering the huge spectrum of ship coins... and I would encourage you to explore this area of numismatics if this is something that might suit your fancy. It could transform you into a great historian and possibly allow you to assemble a totally unique and fabulous maritime coin collection just the way you envision it. I would like to wish you all "bon voyage" on your coin collecting journey. ♦



Privy Mark Grabs Collector Interest

Sales figures for the U.S. Mint show slow but steady increases across the board. One notable increase includes the Proof Silver Eagle with the Army Anniversary privy mark. When the last issue of Mint Stats went to press, the silver eagle had only been on sale for a short period of time, the sales figure being only a little over 10,000. This month, the number skyrocketed to over 94,000. We will be keeping an eye on that coin to see if it jumps again or if the excitement surrounding it has subsided.

Newly added this month is the 2025 Uncirculated Morgan and Peace dollars, with healthy starting numbers for both pieces. We will have to see how the Proof versions hold up in comparison when they are released.

The addition of the Superman coin and medals, as well as the Texas Innovation dollar, is highly anticipated. The Comic Art series has been a hot topic of discussion within the community, and everyone is anxious to see how they do in terms of sales.





JOHN REICH

From 1795 through 1807, a graceful head of Liberty, thought to have been designed by famed artist Gilbert Stuart, adorned our silver and copper coinage, but in the latter year, another Liberty head began to appear, this time by assistant mint engraver John Reich.


Born in Fürth, Bavaria - now part of Germany - in August 1767, he was the son of a distinguished engraver, Johann Christian Reich. The infant child was christened Johann Matthäus Reich, but after coming to America, he anglicized his name to the simpler John Reich.

The younger Reich grew up at his father's side and learned his engraving skills at first hand. The two sometimes collaborated on medallic commissions, but most of the work signed "Reich" and produced in Bavaria was actually done by the father.

Even though the younger Reich was a qualified engraver by the age of 20, there was only limited work available to him in Bavaria over the next several years. He eventually decided that his fortune would be found in the New World and, in May 1800, signed on at the port of Hamburg as an indentured servant for a voyage to America. This indenture meant that the ship's captain had the right to sell his services in the United States in order to pay for the voyage.

In mid-August 1800, the ship arrived at the Philadelphia docks, and Reich was indentured to John Brown, a local silversmith, for a period of two years. It was not long, however, before Philadelphia Mint Chief Coiner Henry Voight learned of the new arrival and met with Reich; the chief coiner arranged for the indenture, or at least a major part of it, to be paid off, allowing Reich to pursue private commissions for medals.

In 1801, Reich prepared the dies for the Jefferson Indian Peace medals and soon afterwards began work on one of

his most famous medals, honoring the 25th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence and the Inauguration of Thomas Jefferson as President. The latter work was done in close cooperation with Chief Coiner Voight and Mint Director Elias Boudinot.

The Jefferson Indian Peace Medals have a surprisingly close association with the present day. The 2004 nickels with the clasped hands reverse took its design directly from the dies prepared by John Reich in 1801; moreover, these very medals were distributed by famed explorers Lewis & Clark on their famous expedition to the Pacific Ocean. Reich also did the Indian Peace medal dies for President James Madison in 1814.

From 1802 to early 1807, Reich struggled financially as the medallic commissions were few and far between. Two of the more interesting pieces were the medals for Commodore Truxtun in 1802 and that for Commodore Preble four years later. Both medals had been awarded by Congress for naval victories, the first against the French in 1800 and the second against the Barbary pirates of North Africa.

At the end of June 1805, Elias Boudinot retired as mint director, and his replacement was Robert Patterson, an eminent professor of mathematics and the personal choice of President Thomas Jefferson. Patterson was not only a man of intelligence, but had those skills deemed important to the post: a knowledge of mathematics and science. In addition, in a matter important then and now, he was a member of the same political party as the President.

After due consideration, Patterson had come to believe that the current heads of Liberty found on the gold, silver, and copper coins of the United States ought to be changed to reflect the new era that began with the 1800 election of Thomas Jefferson to the presidency.

By early 1807, Director Patterson had definitely decided to change the designs on the current coinage. To this end, he approached John Reich to carry out this task. Reich was told, of course, that bringing him into the Mint needed the written approval of the President.

On March 25, 1807, Patterson wrote the President that "Our present Engraver, Mr. Scot, is yet so far advanced in life, that he cannot very long be expected to continue his labors. In the event of his sickness or death, the business of the Institution would probably be stopped for some time, since few, if anyone, could be found to supply his place, except Mr. Reich, an artist with whose talents, I presume, you are not unacquainted..."

Patterson went on to say that Reich was planning to return to Europe within a

short time and haste was therefore necessary to keep him in the U.S. According to the mint director, a "small salary would, however, retain him in the country, and secure his services to the Mint - And in truth, the beauty of our coins would be greatly improved by the assistance of his masterly hand."

This letter proved to be decisive, and the President soon agreed to the proposal. On April 1, Reich began his duties at the Mint and was to remain there for a decade, all the while producing dies for coins and medals.

Once Reich was formally an employee of the Mint at an annual salary of \$600, Patterson lost little time in directing his talents towards a complete redesign of the gold, silver, and copper coins of the United

States. There is a general belief in some quarters of the numismatic world that Reich was solely responsible for the work, but such is far from being true. He certainly prepared the final drawings and then the necessary dies, but there was considerable work before those events came about.

In particular, Mint Director Patterson almost certainly prepared sketches, or had them done to his orders, of how


the new coins should look. These preliminary drawings would, of course, have been very rough in nature but showed Reich exactly what was intended.

One of the reasons, though unstated in the official correspondence, for hiring Reich was that Scot was a Federalist, the implication being that someone from the wrong political party was not capable of doing quality design work on United States coins.

Considering that a skilled workman of the time earned between \$300 and \$400 per year and that Chief Engraver Robert Scot received an annual salary of \$1,200, it may easily be seen that Reich was not being overpaid for his work and was, in fact, somewhat underpaid. The United States Government was rewarded many times over for the \$600 annual salary it gave to Reich. (In those days, salaries for

officers were paid quarterly, meaning that Reich received \$150 every three months.)

Reich began his duties at the Mint on April 1, 1807; almost immediately, Patterson set him to work on the new designs to appear on all the coins then being struck at the Mint, from the copper half cent to the gold half eagle. The silver dollar and eagle (\$10 gold piece) did not see the Reich design, as they had last been struck in 1804.

With Patterson carefully watching every step of the design process, by the late summer of 1807, Reich had produced his basic Liberty head, now called the Capped Bust by collectors. Clearly, Patterson had something very particular in mind for the new Liberty head, and Reich must have struggled to meet the stringent requirements set by the director.

By an odd twist of fate, in later years, a rumor arose among mint officers that Reich had used "his fat mistress" as the model for the coinage. This curious belief was not written down until the 1860s, but it is very difficult to believe today. If Reich had known a woman from the 'wrong side of the tracks' as was implied by the 1860s memorandum, then this fact would certainly have been known to the small group of the educated elite in Philadelphia, including, in particular, the mint director.

Patterson would never have allowed Reich to use the profile of a woman who would not have been accepted in polite society. In addition, had one of the President's political enemies learned of such a story, it certainly would have been used by Congressional opponents against the Jefferson Administration with telling effect. Nothing of this sort happened, and it is therefore safe to say that the rumor put on paper in the 1860s was merely a case of professional jealousy on someone's part.

We do not know when the first Reich designed coins were struck, but in 1860 Mint Director James Ross Snowden reported that half dollars with the new Liberty head were first coined in September 1807; there is some suspicion that he simply made up the date when no evidence of any kind could be found in the Mint records. It may well be correct, but on the other hand, coinage could have begun, for example, in early October, and the 1807 date continued for several weeks into 1808,



thus accounting for the relative availability of this date. (Shortly after the first Reich half dollars were struck, the Mint began coining half eagles with a similar design.)

The obverse, with its Capped Bust Liberty head, was not the only change made by Reich at Patterson's direction. For the gold and silver coins there was a new reverse eagle, greatly changed from the one that had been used for the past several

years; this earlier eagle was a direct copy from the Great Seal of the United States and had first been put on the coinage in 1796 at the express direction of President Washington and Mint Director Boudinot.

The new eagle did not resemble the one on the Great Seal at all. Patterson apparently assumed that he could change the official eagle at will as long as he kept the motto, E PLURIBUS UNUM ("one

out of many"). Later, mint directors considered the retention of the motto as a mistake, and it was removed from the coinage in the 1830s. Mint Director Samuel Moore, in particular, believed that this Latin phrase was merely another way of saying "United States" and that the name of the country ought to appear only once on the coinage, not twice. In 1873, the motto was returned to the coinage in the

mistaken belief that it had been wrongly removed nearly four decades earlier.

(It is worth noting that the motto correctly appears on the Kennedy half dollar at the present time because the reverse is modelled on the Great Seal of the United States. It is not appropriate, however, on the other coins if we accept the views of Samuel Moore and others who investigated the use of the motto in the 1820s and 1830s. Moore even wrote former president Thomas Jefferson in his quest for information on the subject.)

As time passed, Reich added his head of Liberty to all of the coins then currently being struck, with the last one being the quarter dollar, which did not receive its new look until the fall of 1815. In some cases, such as the half dime of 1829, the Reich design was added to the coinage, but the work was done by another hand, in this case, Chief Engraver William Kneass.

The Liberty head by Reich was not quite similar on all denominations. The general motif was the same, but this varied from metal to metal, the head on the copper, for example, having a relatively larger profile than the half eagle or half dollar.

In 1809, the Liberty Head on the half dollar was improved so that the coins would strike up better, and in 1813, the half eagle received a facelift from Reich. The latter was a strong change; half eagles by Reich dated 1807 through 1812 are called Draped Bust to Left, while the 1813 version has a new name: Capped Bust to Left.

There is some agreement among specialists that Reich signed his coinage dies in various ways. The clasp on gold and silver coins has what appears to be various aspects of his initials, such as J, JR, R, or JMR. In addition, the star at the lower right on the obverse is defective on some coins and is thought to be a sign that Reich executed these particular dies.

Reich remained at the Mint until March 1817, when it became apparent to all that his eyesight had failed so badly that he was no longer capable of the finely executed work that was necessary in coinage and medal dies. Some researchers believe that it was Reich, and not Scot as

commonly reported, that prepared the new cent dies of 1816; many consider this design as one of the least attractive to appear on American coins.

The War of 1812 created many Congressional gold medals, and Reich was given the contract to prepare the Naval medal dies. Those for Captain Isaac Hull were prepared in 1815 and

used to strike the necessary medals. In 1816, Reich began work on the Captain Stephen Decatur dies, but the work was so badly done for the reverse that the Navy Department refused to accept it. Reich

resigned not long afterwards as his failing eyesight was now evident.

The Reich designs remained on the coinage until the mid-1830s when a new mint director, Dr. Robert M. Patterson, arrived on the scene. Oddly enough, this Robert Patterson was a son of the former mint director who had hired John Reich, but the younger Patterson did not like the old designs and soon found his own

engraver, Christian Gobrecht, to create new artwork, beginning with the silver dollar of 1836.

Little is known of Reich's activities after 1817, but Stewart Witham, who investigated Reich and his engraving work very carefully over a number of years, believed that he died about 1832 at some unknown city "in the West," perhaps in Ohio or Pennsylvania.

Those collectors desiring to own a specimen of Reich's head of Liberty will have little trouble or expense in doing so. The general designs were used for nearly 30 years on several denominations (the eagle did not appear on the copper coins, however), and there are numerous issues that sell in very fine or better condition for only a relatively small sum. In lesser grades, some of these coins would be very inexpensive. ♦

Certifying Cast Coins

Is there an additional premium on a coin that is housed in old PCGS rattler holders?

Slab collectors will pay an additional premium for a rattler because they are interested in the holder more than because of their interest in the imprisoned coin. There are also some collectors who consider the earliest certified coins to have been graded to a stricter standard than coins being certified today. For that reason, the so-called rattlers have been known to sell for some unexpected premium prices.

Can you offer any guidance on collecting slabs?

In general, slab collectors view the most desirable encapsulations as being Accugrade, sample, ANACS blue text, Compugrade, NGC white label, NGC black, PCGS Doily, PCGS "rattler," PCGS regency, and PCGS white label slabs. Some of these encapsulations were used for a very brief time, while the survival rate of others is very low.

Is there any place I can learn more about collecting slabs?

Can coins that were cast rather than struck be certified as being genuine?

Some ancient Celtic, Greek, Roman, and Chinese, as well as 1776 New Hampshire coins, were cast rather than struck. The weight, a visual inspection, and examination of the edge of the coins for a tell-tale seam can help authenticate or disqualify them. Numismatic Guaranty Corporation examines ancient coins; however will not certify any cast coins.

Can you explain why 1776 New Hampshire colonial coins were cast rather than being struck?

There are perhaps eight or nine 1776 New Hampshire coppers known. New Hampshire appears to have considered authorizing these coins prior to the signing of the Declaration of Independence. It was recommended to the General Assembly that William Scoultin, a silversmith, could make up to 100 pounds of copper coins. No record of this coinage has ever been found; however, the coins do exist and were cast rather than struck. The lack of records suggests the General Assembly didn't formally approve the coppers. The examples regarded as being genuine display light surface porosity, as might be expected due to the casting process.

Are there other modern coins that were cast rather than struck?

Sweden cast coins and plate money during the 1600s. Russia likewise cast plate money "ingots" during the 1700s. Between 1792 and 1873, Morocco cast falus-denominated coins in bronze. Japan cast coins until 1867, while China cast coins until the early 20th century. This is not an exhaustive list. I am unaware of any other legitimate Colonial or U.S. coins that were cast rather than being struck.

New Issues Can Be Fickle

New collector coin issues can be fickle. A few increase in value following their initial release; however, there are many that decline in value once they reach the secondary market. Good examples of this are most of the issues in the modern series of non-circulating legal tender commemoratives, modern Mint, and modern Proof sets. This is where it could get interesting, with perhaps a cautionary 'buyer beware' to be watched. The U.S. Mint has launched its Comic Art Coin and Medal Program, the initial offering featuring the DC Comics superhero Superman. The program offers a

.9999 fine half-ounce gold \$50 coin priced significantly higher than its equivalent, the 2025 half-ounce \$25 Gold American Eagle. The silver versions in the Superman program are a 2.5 and one-ounce piece, each being a medal rather than a coin. Once again, the mint's price is significantly higher than the 2025 one-ounce \$1 Silver American Eagle. Exuberant purchasers, not all being coin collectors, will likely be thrilled to purchase the Superman items, but what about investors? Also, what about the secondary market, which is comprised primarily of coin collectors? The American Arts Gold medal series was just that—medals, not coins. We've seen what happened there. One of the biggest

questions whose answer will spell success or failure for the Comic Art program is if the coins as well as the medals will be viewed as an expensive competition to the bullion and Proof versions of the Gold and Silver American Eagles or if Superman will be viewed as truly being super, with the Comic Arts series becoming something popular not only with comic character enthusiasts, but have staying power with coin collectors and serious investors as well. ♦

Seven Circulating Varieties of '82 Cents Exist

Coins aren't always rare or overlooked. Coins, like 1982 Lincoln cents, can be interesting for many reasons.

Most believe the Lincoln cent's composition has basically never changed, except for the 1943 steel cents.

In fact, there were a number of other compositions. From 1944 to 1946, the Mint used an alloy derived from shell casings. It included a bit of tin, but to the casual observer, it appeared the cent had been restored to its normal composition.

The changes in 1943 opened the door to more experiments with the cent. Until 1962, the composition was 95 percent copper and 5 percent zinc and tin. The change in 1962 was probably a result of the increased need for cents. It was a small change, as the alloy was set at 95 percent copper and 5 percent zinc. The elimination of tin helped production, and officials were confident it would have no adverse impact on the ability of the coins to last with substantial wear. The makeup of the cent was subject to economic pressures from the rising copper price. Officials had several options: the cent could be discontinued, the government could spend more than one cent to produce each Lincoln cent, or the composition could be changed to keep production costs under face value. The last option seemed to be the best.

In December of 1973, the Secretary of the Treasury was given the power to change the composition of the cent. The idea at the time seemed to be aluminum.

More than 1 million 1974 aluminum cents were produced, but the price of copper fell, and the idea ran into serious opposition. The aluminum cents were destroyed before being released, although a few have survived, as some were given out as samples to officials.

In 1982, however, the pressure of rising copper prices forced officials into making a decision. The options were the same as in the past. There had been a Research Triangle Institute report calling for the elimination of the cent, as it was too costly to produce and did not circulate well. Officials balked at the idea, not wanting to be responsible for dumping Abraham Lincoln's coin and forcing Americans to round purchases.

A composition change was the safest decision. The result was a composition of 97.6 percent zinc and 2.4 percent copper. The copper was a plating to give the coins a "normal" appearance.

It was another triumph of American engineering, for few noticed the change. In 1982, cents were produced from the old

and the new composition. The new composition cents are 2.5 grams, as opposed to the old 3.11 grams.

With a composition change, it was only natural to modify the dates. Date modifications in 1960 and 1970 had resulted in small- and large-date cents. The same thing happened in 1982.


Date modification and composition change resulted in an assortment of 1982 cents. While none are rare, there are Philadelphia 1982 copper large- and small-date cents. There are also 1982 zinc large- and small-date cents from Philadelphia. Denver produced copper large-date cents, as well as small- and large-date zinc cents. San Francisco produced a proof.

A collection of 1982-dated cents is a nice assortment. The copper-plated zinc 1982 small date is the most expensive at \$9, while the others range from 10 cents to \$6.

For those wanting a bit of history, a 1982 collection is a good idea, and at today's prices, you cannot go wrong. ♦
